


EXECUTIVE SUMMARY




It is heartening to see the support and generosity that The Stonyhurst Foundation has continued to receive throughout the period from September 2021 to August 2022. The Stonyhurst Foundation are truly grateful to all the donors who have contributed so generously to its cause, as well as to Stonyhurst for its continued support to Foundation activity.

The Stonyhurst Foundation is delighted to confirm that during the financial year to 31 August 2022, they received £2,451,193 in donations. Additionally, £701,143 was granted from The Stonyhurst Foundation to Stonyhurst for bursary and fee assistance funding, reflecting the Foundation's commitment to supporting students in need. This grant allowed 33 pupils to attend Stonyhurst and Stonyhurst St Mary's Hall who otherwise would have been unable to do so, a magnificent achievement for which The Stonyhurst Foundation is so grateful to the Stonyhurst family.





Receiving a bursary to attend Stonyhurst transformed my life in more ways than I could have imagined. Stonyhurst taught me the value of pushing beyond my limits and provided the freedom to explore various aspects of life, both physical and philosophical.

I am forever grateful for the education and opportunities I received at Stonyhurst, as they have shaped me into the person I am today and opened doors to a world of possibilities.'

In a remarkable event on February 9th 2022, the Stonyhurst Classics and Philosophy Society organised a marathon reading of Homer's 'Odyssey' - an ancient Greek epic poem. This narrative follows the heroic journey of Odysseus, the King of Ithaca, as he returns home after the Trojan War, enduring numerous challenges over a decade.

With an ambitious goal of £2,000, symbolizing £100 for each year of Odysseus' absence, the Society's fundraising efforts surpassed expectations, reaching £3,605 even before the reading began. These funds will support the St Aloysius Rhetoric 2022 Bursary, lightening the financial load for deserving students at Stonyhurst.

The event, starting at 9 am and spanning twelve hours, witnessed unwavering support from the Stonyhurst community. 82 readers, including pupils, staff, OS, parents, collectively embraced the initiative. Remarkably, support poured in from OS scholars worldwide, with messages, donations, and readings, including one in Greek.

This exceptional event was masterminded by Adrienne and Maddy from Rhetoric, showcasing their unwavering dedication. Their vision united the Stonyhurst family globally, fostering a shared love for the Classics and inspiring future generations. Our sincerest thanks to both Adrienne and Maddy for organising and for everyone that took part and donated.
